Don't wait, check your rates

Find out your RV comparison and your payable rates by following these steps:

- 1. Look up your business' postcode
- 2. Input the postcode in the valuations website www.saa.gov.uk. After selecting your property, you will be able to switch between tabs to compare your new 2015 RV to the 2010 RV.
- 3. Input the postcode in the Scottish Government's calculator http://bit.ly/2j4sRT4

It will show your new RV, the business rates you will be liable to pay and any reliefs that apply (e.g. Small Business Bonus scheme).

How are rates calculated?

Rateable Value (RV) The property's approximate open market rental value, determined by the area's rating Assessor.

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Poundage Rate (PR) Multiplier applied to the RV, set annually by the Scottish Government. 2016-17: 48.4 pence 2017-18: 46.6 pence

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or

Large Business Supplement 2016-17: 2.6 pence for £35,000+ 2017-18: 2.6 pence for £51,000+

Reliefs Small Business Bonus, Rural or

Charitable Relief, etc.

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The Scottish Government has proposed the following changes in the Scottish Budget 2017-18:

- Reduce the poundage rate to 46.6%
- Raise the band at which the Large Business Supplement is applied to properties with an RV of £51,000 or more.
- Reduce the band at which the Small Business Bonus scheme applies, to properties with an RV of £15,000 or less.

However, even if these changes are approved in the Budget, it is estimated that Aberdeen's offices and industrial properties may experience an average 20-30% increase.
